



A WORD FROM OUR CEO

Reflecting on the remarkable work CHEXS has achieved over the past academic year fills me with an overwhelming sense of pride.

Since the charity's inception in October 2010, I have been amazed by the passion and dedication of our team, volunteers, stakeholder schools and partners, who are committed to supporting children and families. What began as a vision to empower children and strengthen family relationships has grown into a dynamic charity, grounded in our mission and driven by our dedication to the communities we serve.

For the last 13 years, CHEXS has been dedicated to creating opportunities for children, young people (CYP), and families, focusing on both their educational needs and the daily stresses faced by parents through family support services (FSS). We believe in offering a listening ear for parents and ensuring children have early, age-appropriate opportunities to build their self-esteem and resilience. Research shows that children from financially insecure families lag behind their peers by an average of 10 months in primary school and 19 months in secondary school. ***In the past year alone, we've supported over 300 children and 170 parents***, helping them navigate challenges and develop the confidence to succeed. Instead of focusing on "interventions," we emphasise meaningful opportunities that allow young people to discover their strengths and thrive, with peer support playing a vital role in this process. A national strategy is needed to ensure early opportunities equip young people with life skills and academic knowledge to succeed in today's evolving world, including helping families stay connected through a listening ear and support.

As we look at the landscape today, the challenges facing vulnerable families continue to grow. The cost-of-living crisis, combined with years of cuts to state school budgets, has left many children, especially those who are socially excluded, without access to the opportunities that should be available to all. Research shows a significant correlation between parental income and a child's ability to become an innovator—highlighting the need for equal access to education, resources, and support networks. ***CHEXS is determined to bridge that gap, ensuring that talented children from low-income backgrounds have the opportunities they need to unlock their potential and thrive.***

Despite the mounting obstacles, our charity remains steadfast in its mission. We are committed to creating inclusive programmes that provide extended learning opportunities for all children, not just those who can afford them. - ➔ **Bond across diverse backgrounds:** Our events build an inclusive environment where families from different cultures can come together, share experiences, and form lasting connections.
- ➔ **Spend quality time together:** We create a safe, fun space where families can engage in activities that encourage communication, collaboration, and shared enjoyment.
- ➔ **Achieve goals and meet challenges together:** Through our activities, families can work together, whether it's through friendly competition or working towards a shared goal, strengthening their family bonds in the process.
- ➔ **Engage the entire community:** Our events are designed for everyone—children, parents, and extended family members—creating a sense of unity across the community.



Intergenerational Support

CHEXS has been hosting weekly "Time for You" sessions at the Beaumont Centre in Cheshunt, offering adults from the community a welcoming space to come together. These sessions provide an opportunity for participants to enjoy a tea or coffee, engage in conversation, and take part in activities such as crafts and games. The "Time for You" sessions offer more than just a casual meet-up.



They provide:

- ➔ **A safe space to escape isolation**
- ➔ **Opportunities to form new friendships across generations**
- ➔ **A warm, welcoming atmosphere**
- ➔ **A trusted, listening ear**

Local Collaborations

CHEXS remains dedicated to supporting local initiatives that benefit our community and its families. This year, we actively participated in the B3 Living community event and joined forces with the local community to fundraise for Theobalds Christchurch.

In addition, we collaborated with our local Argos store to deliver breakfast bags to **100** families in need. Working closely with our partner schools, we identified families requiring food support and ensured that these essential resources reached those most in need.

Tailored Family Support

This year, we have adapted our services to better meet the specific needs of the families we support, focusing on the key reasons for referral. By carefully identifying challenges such as attendance, low self-esteem, limited aspirations, financial concerns, housing issues, children's behaviour, and anxiety, we have been able to provide targeted assistance. Our approach involves connecting families with specialised services, including ADD-Vance, SPACE, Beacon, Safer Places, SFYP, DSLP4, and Broxbourne Council. Additionally, we've delivered a range of FREE group parenting sessions on topics such as:

- ⇒ Establishing boundaries and routines, and managing behaviours
- ⇒ Supporting children with emotionally based school avoidance
- ⇒ Helping with school transitions
- ⇒ Addressing and supporting your child's SEN (Special Educational Needs)

⇒ Food & Fuel Support

CHEXS was selected by Broxbourne Council to distribute vouchers to local families in need, through the Household Support Fund and Food & Heat Grant. This funding allowed us to provide essential support, with vouchers totaling £7,556.91.




These vouchers helped families cover costs for utilities, fuel, and food, offering crucial assistance that contributed to:

- ⇒ Improved mental health
- ⇒ Reduced stress levels
- ⇒ Increased emotional well-being
- ⇒ Essential financial relief

Through this initiative, CHEXS was able to provide timely and much-needed support, helping to ease the burden on vulnerable families during challenging times.

Reasons for referral

The main reason for referral this year for our family support team was for emotional wellbeing with 18% of parents / carers referred for this reason.



Increasing our reach

CHEXS has continued to uphold the extended hours introduced last year for our family support team, ensuring we can meet the demand from disadvantaged families whose children are struggling to reach their full potential at school. The need for our services continues to rise, reflecting the increasing challenges many families and children across the UK face.

These challenges range from the ongoing cost of living crisis, severe poverty due to insufficient household income, and parental instability, to poor social networks, lack of positive parenting skills, inadequate emotional resilience, and diminishing community support resources. Our team works closely with parents to address the root causes of family stress, including financial difficulties, unemployment, and housing concerns.

Many of the parents we support have children involved in, or who have previously participated in, our GROWTH programme, so they are already familiar with our work and trust our services.

CHEXS are proud that our families praise us for our reliability, knowledge and the trusted support we offer.

CHEXS Growth Programme

CHEXS is dedicated to helping young people not only achieve academic success but also develop the confidence and life skills essential for their future. Our focus is on supporting individuals under the age of 18, particularly those who need it most.

Our 30-week GROWTH Programme is specifically designed to inspire children and young people to thrive beyond the traditional classroom setting by boosting their confidence and self-esteem.

The programme is built around 4 core pillars:

- ➔ **Meaning and Purpose**
- ➔ **Resilience**
- ➔ **Expectations**
- ➔ **Aspirations**

This year, we proudly supported 225 young people through this transformative programme.

Warburtons Transition project

Our Transition Project has been highly successful in supporting **86** young people as they move from primary to secondary school—a critical period for their development.

By offering targeted support, including one-on-one coaching and strong communication between schools, parents, and CHEXS, we've helped ease school avoidance and emotional challenges.

The project builds positive, trusting relationships with parents and schools, many of whom previously faced anxiety or distrust. The results are inspiring:

- ➔ **Improved attendance**
- ➔ **Academic success**
- ➔ **Greater emotional resilience among participants**


With backing from partners like Warburtons, we've raised awareness of these challenges and built a wider support network.

Why it works

CHEXS' award-winning GROWTH programme is designed to meet the complex needs of children referred by schools, offering small groups and high staff ratios for more intensive support. Though more costly than typical activities, it delivers meaningful results by focusing on:

- ➔ **Problem-solving:** Teaching children to find solutions and build resilience.
- ➔ **Leadership:** Providing opportunities to develop confidence and unlock potential.
- ➔ **Teamwork:** Encouraging collaboration and boosting self-esteem.

This targeted approach helps children step outside their comfort zones, gain real-life skills, and grow in confidence. Without such inclusive programmes, many children would miss out on these critical opportunities. CHEXS' success comes from a strong commitment to making a lasting impact through supportive, hands-on guidance.

XTRABRAVILE

JASON'S STORY

Recognizing Jason's struggles, the CHEXS team introduced their Growth Programme – a comprehensive 30-week, 10-step initiative designed to support him through one-on-one coaching. With compassionate guidance, they listened as he opened up, building his confidence and resilience. The looming transition to the intimidating secondary school felt daunting, but the CHEXS Transition project was there to ease his fears. Additionally, their Holiday sessions kept Jason engaged, helping him learn to lead and collaborate with others, empowering him for the challenges ahead.



Jason sat in the back of the classroom, a whirlwind of thoughts and energy, his gaze drifting from the teacher's words to the buzzing lights above.

His parents, busy with their lives, dismissed his restless behavior as mere mischief. Unbeknownst to them, Jason's need for attention—whether in laughter or scolding—grew more desperate each day.

As Jason's confidence improves, new friendships flourish.

With newfound tools to express his feelings, he navigates social situations better building connections that bring him joy.



Jason's journey culminated in a renewed sense of belonging. His parents felt heard and supported, while Jason reflected on his behavior and emotions during CHEXS sessions.

He longed to be seen, to be understood, but in a world that overlooked his struggle, he felt invisible, a silent storm waiting to break.

As he prepared for secondary school, his friendships deepened, and he confidently used his tools to express himself appropriately, ensuring brighter days ahead. Together, they embraced a better future, ready to face challenges with newfound strength and resilience.

The CHEXS team's ability to truly listen and offer empathy is key to our success supporting over 500 families each year. Empathy, a deeply human quality, cannot be replicated—it's what allows us to connect on a personal level with those we help. By actively listening, understanding not only the words but the tone of voice and body language, our team ensures that families feel heard and understood. This attentive approach builds trust, making families feel their concerns are valued. Through this genuine connection, we're able to build strong relationships that lead to meaningful and positive outcomes.

OBJECTIVE 2



CLEO'S STORY

Cleo struggled daily with emotional well-being, her confidence shattered by uncertainty surrounding her special educational needs diagnosis. Battling low self-esteem and mental health concerns, she felt lost in a world that didn't seem to understand her. Her parents, overwhelmed by Cleo's difficulties, faced their own challenges – emotional strain, financial burdens, and a growing sense of helplessness. Despite their love, they were at a loss for how to help their daughter and themselves through these trying times.



The CHEXS team introduced Cleo to their Growth Programme, offering one-on-one coaching over 30 weeks. This personalised support helped her open up, boosting her confidence and addressing her emotional challenges.



CHEXS Holiday sessions provided her with structure during school breaks, giving her parents much-needed respite. Meanwhile, the Family Support team offered parenting advice and regular check-ins, and signposted Cleo's mum to NHS emotional support, ensuring both Cleo and her mum received the care they needed.

FINAL THOUGHTS..

PARENT:

"Real Talk was good, as it was nice to chat to like-minded people that have similar experiences"

CLEO:

"I felt worried when I first came today because I don't like meeting new people. I didn't need to worry because everyone was kind and I actually enjoyed it."



To ease the financial strain, the CHEXS team provided utility and financial support, helping Cleo's parents manage their challenges. Mum attended "Real Talk" sessions for SEND support and received assistance filling out disability living allowance forms.

At first, Cleo struggled with meltdowns during creative projects, but over time, she became more self-aware and mindful of others' feelings. Regular phone calls encouraged Mum, helping her manage her own emotional well-being and better understand Cleo's behavior. Now, with greater SEND knowledge, Mum is more engaged with school and open to support and advice, leading to a stronger relationship with Cleo.

FINANCIAL



Financial Review

The charity has had a successful year, and despite challenging circumstances, has increased income for the seventh consecutive year. This financial stability has allowed us to respond effectively to the significantly heightened demand from families and young people impacted by the ongoing effects of the pandemic and the cost-of-living crisis.

Income

During the year, the charity reported a total income of **£485,759, marking an increase of £68,473 from the previous year.** This increase was driven by an increased Henry Smith award and other fund raising successes, including a first year contribution from Helping Herts. Expenditure was **£480,713, an increase of £41,168 from the previous year.** This resulted in a **surplus of £5,046.** Our income comes from a variety of sources, with the largest contribution being grant income, which represents 57% (£237,025) of the total income. Key contributors include the National Lottery and the Henry Smith Charity. Further, the return of Children in Need will boost this figure in 2025.

National Lottery funding for our Family Support commenced on the 3rd of March 2023, and we are currently in the second year of this four-year grant, totalling £425,000. This funding has significantly boosted our capacity for family support services, which have experienced nearly a 50% increase in demand.

CHEXS was awarded a Henry Smith Charity Improving Lives Grant of £186,000 to cover three years of running costs for a project supporting families from disadvantaged communities in Waltham Cross, Hertfordshire. This grant underscores our commitment to providing essential support and expanding services to meet the needs of children and their parents.

Our board has remained dedicated to our staff's wellbeing, approving salary inflation adjustments and additional support to address the cost-of-living crisis. Staff costs have risen from £364,397 to £388,236, a total increase of £23,839, reflecting increased staff hours and our commitment to supporting both our employees and the wider community. The organisation remains in a strong financial position, with **overall funds of £145,788, comprising £24,274 in restricted funds carried forward and £121,514 in unrestricted funds.** Including deferred income receipts, the cash balance was £230,939, providing a solid foundation to address future challenges.

Reserves Policy

The CHEXS board diligently monitors the charity's reserves and actively works with the Operational Senior Leadership Team to diversify and strengthen funding streams. While using reserves is not preferred, the board recognises that the exceptional challenges faced this financial year justify their use. Ensuring the charity's ability to continue supporting families during difficult times is our priority. We are committed to rebuilding and increasing our reserves to secure future stability.

Our reserves policy is regularly reviewed to ensure it meets our operational needs. The goal is to maintain approximately three months of operational costs (£90,000) and up to £30,000 for staff redundancy costs. This ensures we have sufficient reserves to address unexpected income shortfalls and fulfil our financial obligations.

Looking forward, we anticipate higher expenditure to meet growing demand. This will necessitate increased reserves to protect our services from short-term financial disruptions and, in extreme situations, to cover redundancy costs if operations were to cease.

Currently, **our unrestricted reserves stand at £121,514, with £30,000 designated for redundancy and £91,514 in unrestricted free reserves.** We are committed to maintaining and growing these reserves in line with our policy to ensure the charity's sustainability.

➔ *Reflecting on the past year, we recognise both the incredible strides we’ve made and the significant challenges that remain.*

The cost-of-living crisis, compounded by the impact of the pandemic and years of state school budget cuts, has left many families struggling to provide basic necessities like clothing, food, and heating. The statistics are sobering: **91% of families report difficulties meeting clothing needs**, and **41% now rely on food banks to make ends meet**. For children from financially insecure backgrounds, the **education gap is widening—by 10 months in primary school and a staggering 19 months by secondary school**.

This growing inequality is creating a tiered system where vulnerable families are increasingly excluded from opportunities that wealthier families can afford. If we look at CHEXS data from the families we have supported, we could categorise needs into 4 tiers:

- ➔ **Tier 1: Families struggling to clothe, feed, and keep a home warm.**
- ➔ **Tier 2: Families unable to cover the cost of enrolling their children in extended learning opportunities, from music and drama lessons to sports clubs and extra tutoring to help catch up with age-related learning in subjects like maths and English.**
- ➔ **Tier 3: Parents unable to pay for private assessments for an Education, Health Care Plan (EHCP). Families that can afford private assessments can reduce wait times from over 70 weeks to about 20 weeks.**
- ➔ **Tier 4 (Proposed): How have additional barriers in state education further excluded your child? What challenges have you faced as parents/carers?**

CHEXS remains committed to addressing this divide. Our data reflects the tiered nature of need among the families we serve, from those struggling to afford basic necessities to those unable to cover the cost of extracurricular activities or vital educational support.

Despite these challenges, we are optimistic. **CHEXS, together with our partners, continues to provide vital support to families**, helping them navigate these difficult times. Our bespoke framework for building resilience and fostering aspirations in young people has made a lasting impact, and the trust we’ve built with families enables us to continue delivering meaningful support. We are deeply grateful to our partners, funders, and volunteers for their unwavering belief in our mission.
